To be eligible for CARE, you must:

- Self-identify as Asian, Asian American, Native Hawaiian and/or Pacific Islander (AANHPI)
- 18 years old or older
- Can read and speak one of the following languages: English, Chinese (Mandarin, Cantonese), Hawaiian, Hindi, Ilocano, Japanese, Korean, Samoan, Tagalog or Vietnamese
- Reside in the United States (US) or U.S. Associated Pacific Islands (USAPI)
- Have an interest in participating in potential research
